This week is a good opportunity to think about how we can encourage our children to read more, and how we can expose them to more text and stories by reading to them and with them. It is also very good for children to see adults modelling reading behaviours. We can think about our household routines – do we allow time for children to read before bed time? Do we encourage them to take books with them for journeys or on outings? Is reading the first choice of activity when they get home from school? Do I prioritise reading to my children every day (even older children)?

Developing a love of reading is the best way to secure academic success.

Friendship Assembly -Year 2 teacher:

A few weeks ago Mr McKernan presented an assembly about Friendship.

Firstly he gave advice on how the year ones and two's could be friends. He offered advice on how to be good friends. After the assembly the children were thinking about how to be kind to each other.
